## HOME American Rescue Plan Funds

The Lee Board of County Commissioners on Tuesday accepted \$3,802,106 in HOME funds received through the American Rescue Plan. Funding will be used for the acquisition of affordable housing, non-profit capital and infrastructure improvements, as well as increased outreach funding to support community needs resulting from COVID-19.

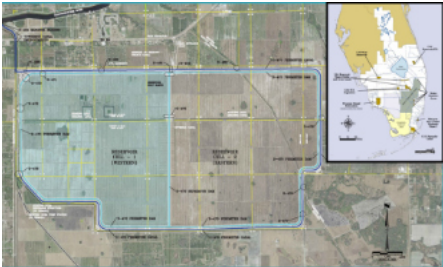

The Lee Board of County Commissioners on Tuesday approved an agreement with Florida Gulf Coast University (FGCU) for a water quality and treatment research project at the C-43 Water Quality Treatment and Testing Project Boma site in Glades County. This project will test various methods for nitrogen removal from the Caloosahatchee River in order to improve water quality.

Lee County Domestic Animal Services offers a Microchip Clinic from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. every Monday through Friday (excluding holidays). Pet owners can be certain their pet's microchip is up to date or get their pet microchipped for just \$10.
