



## Are You & Your Neighbors Ready for the August Election?

### 12 Steps for Voter Readiness

Local elections are sometimes won or lost by just a few hundred votes. With the changing election rules across Florida, make sure you are ready and able to vote in the School Board and Primary election on August 18.

- Verify or obtain your Real ID Florida Driver's License, passport or Florida ID Card. [Learn more](#).
- Snowbirds, add your July/August address to get your ballot for this summer's School Board and Primary elections. Check your voter status [HERE](#).
- Update Your Signature at least every 5 years. Do it [HERE](#).
- Confirm Vote-by-Mail Request [HERE](#).
- Sign up for Ballot Traxx, so you know when your ballot is mailed out, received, and tallied. Sign up [HERE](#).
- Beginning in July, you can get your voter guide in person from the Democratic Party of Lee County, 3949 Evans Avenue, Ste. 109, Fort Myers, print it from our [website](#), pick it up from your Precinct Leader or from a poll greeter when you vote.
- Encourage Independent Voters to enroll with the Democratic Party to participate in the races for Governor, Senator, and Congress.
- Know your Early Voting Ballot drop-off locations, and the days and times they are open. [Learn more](#).
- Recognize that your election day poll will likely be different from early voting sites. [Map it and be ready](#).
- Volunteer on a team of poll greeters, poll watches or ballot curers ASAP to get on the preparation Zoom call. Volunteer [HERE](#).
- Offer neighbors a ride to the Early Voting drop-off or polling station. Sign up [HERE](#).
- Understand preliminary election results are not final until a few days after the election.
